Air pollution refers to the pollution resulting from gases, dust, fumes and other substances which can be harmful to humans, animals, plants and all living things. The air is polluted and unclean. Air pollution affects the earth's atmosphere.

The atmosphere of the earth is like a blanket of air which protects all living things. Without the atmosphere, life would not exist. The atmosphere protects living things from the heat of the sun during the day and at night. **It** prevents the warm air from escaping. Basically, the atmosphere helps keep the living things on earth from burning up or freezing.

It is difficult to completely escape air pollution since air is the source from which people get the oxygen to breathe. Pollution can travel with the wind from one place to another and spread over remote areas. Pollution can be caused by humans or it can also occur naturally. For example, natural pollution may come from volcanoes, forest fires, windstorms, and other sources in nature.

Man is also responsible for polluting the air we breathe. Smoke and fumes from manufacturing plants and various industries are examples of **man-made** pollution. The burning of fossil fuels used for transportation is a major source of pollution as well. Household waste and pesticides make the problem even worse. Reducing pollution, in fact, is not the responsibility of governments alone. Individual people, for instance, can grow more plants and contribute to recycling efforts.

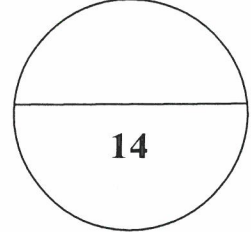

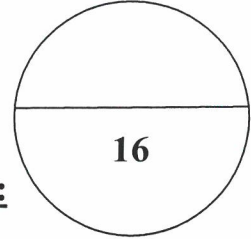

Oto believes that if you want something, you have to work hard for it. He worked very hard at school to get into Waseda University. He also worked hard at sports such as baseball, basketball, and swimming, and he worked hard to get a good job.

Oto got married in 2001, and he now has two young sons. In 2007, he also decided to change his job. Now he works as a schoolteacher in Tokyo. As a teacher, Oto believes that his students will learn that people are the same with or without disabilities.

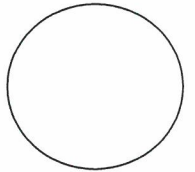

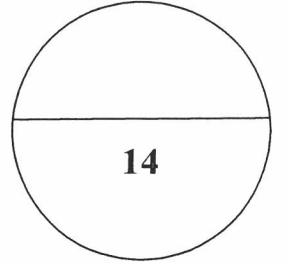
