At the supermarket these days, there is often a section that sells just organic products. There are also many new stores opening up that specialise just in organic fruits and vegetables. Organic food is becoming more and more popular these days as people have become aware of its benefits.

People need to understand why something is labelled 'organic' in order to make the best choices when buying food for themselves and their families. Organic food companies across the world agree on what qualifies a product as organic: such products are grown without chemical fertilizers or pesticides that are usually used to stop insects from damaging crops. Also, farm animals, such as cows and chickens, must not be injected with unnatural growth hormones or antibiotics. These standards result in healthier and tastier food. Without poisonous pesticides and chemical fertilizers, crop plants produce more antioxidants and other beneficial nutrients. Fertilizer pollution is a major environmental problem that affects places far away from farms. Their mass production causes global warming. On the other hand, organic farming tends to have limited environmental effects as it encourages the responsible use of energy and natural resources. The farmers, their families and their communities also benefit from a cleaner and safer environment.

How to tell if a product is organic? At the supermarket, in order to distinguish organically produced foods from traditionally produced ones, consumers must look at package labels and signs. Organic foods must have special labels that guarantee they are grown organically. An official seal also tells you that a product is at least 95 percent organic.

From a health perspective, organic food consumption may reduce the risk of allergy, overweight and obesity. It may also reduce the chances of developing heart diseases. Furthermore, organic foods have higher vitamin and mineral contents that help to strengthen the human immune system. Consequently, organic foods are safer, healthier and poison-free.

Growing organic food is often difficult and requires more land, time and efforts. As a result, organically grown food is more expensive to buy. Many people, however, are willing to pay that extra cost to get the benefit of natural and environmentally friendly foods.
