Abd Al-Rahman Al-Sumait, a remarkable individual whose work continues to inspire generations, was a Kuwaiti physician, Islamic scholar, and philanthropist. Born in Kuwait in 1947, Al-Sumait dedicated his life to serving humanity.

As a high school student, Al-Sumait witnessed something that attracted him to help the poor. Every day, he saw poor workers waiting for their transportation in the heat, outside his school. With the help of his friends, he decided to save up money and buy a car, and from that day, he drove these workers for free. At university, Al Sumait used most of his monthly salary to buy Islamic books and he would give them to mosques. From Muslim students, he would also collect money **which** he used to pay for printing and giving Islamic books throughout Southeast Asia and Africa.

By the time he was 35 years old, he had decided to move to Africa with his wife, and he devoted 29 years of his life there helping millions of children. When he arrived in Africa, he became sad by what he saw. There, children were suffering from hunger and diseases, and families were working very hard to **support** their loved ones. In 1981, Al-Sumait founded the Africa Muslim Agency, later renamed as a "Direct Aid Society". The Society has provided huge humanitarian assistance to poor people throughout Africa. It has built 124 hospitals, 840 schools, 204 Islamic centres, 214 women training centers, and 2,200 mosques. It has provided scholarships to 200 African students to aid them with their studies.
